RECOLLIGO - To gather, regather or flock together



Recolligo explores the diverse relationships between the interior and exterior worlds. The work shares diverse interpretations of the exterior, but also encourages the viewer to seek new definitions of the perceptive interior world of the subconscious.

Painter **E.K. Buckley** relies on her subconscious to develop her expressive and emotionally evocative figures. While painting, Buckley is in a state of wonder and trust while image after image stream in. She watches them, relying on her hand to catch the forms.

Rebecca Aidlin's sensitive sculptural forms explore negative and positive space, light and shadow, through subtleties of shape. The sculptures themselves are a balance of interior and exterior spaces and surfaces. The neutral color invites light and shadow to absorb and describe.

Crystal Gregory's lace work and installation incorporates the domestic and interior art-form of crochet and delicate lace with strong architectural structures. Gregory uses antique lace and vintage pattern to penetrate building material and create domestic sculpture. Repetition rhythmically pushes itself through structural matter to investigate interior space, perpetual breakdown and deterioration.

JiYe Kim's video and installation work "Lost and Found" holds conversations between memory and daily observations. Kim is a collector of images. Her work seeks the intricate relationship between image and meaning.

The show opens on Thursday, February 3rd with an event from 5:30-8:30 pm and runs until Sunday, February 27, 2011.
